4-Nights / 5 -Days Langkawi Itinerary



Langkawi is the main island of an archipelago of 99 islands and only one of two which are inhabited, it has a mountain range in the north running down to the plains in the centre with the rice paddies and then the main city of Kuah in the south. There are numerous islands and bays offering safe anchorages and the islands can be sailed all year round and in any weather conditions. The northern beaches and bays are among the finest in the world. Langkawi is a gorgeous cruising area, featuring high cliffs and hundreds of potential excursions. Swim in a freshwater lake, or visit the wildlife sanctuary to see sea eagles and monkeys.

The islands were given a World Geopark status by Unesco in 2007. The main conservation areas are Machincang Cambrian Geoforest Park, Dayang Bunting Marble Geoforest Park and last but not least Kilim Karst Geoforest park. These areas are the most popular areas for tourists and due to their protected nature are something you don't want to miss.





Day 1: Telaga Harbour to Datai Bay

Guest's will be met at Langkawi's International Airport and brought to Talaga Harbour only 10 minutes away. After the welcome aboard Schooner Dallinghoo the Captain will conduct the safety briefing, you will depart port and sail to Datai Bay where you can have your first swim in the Andaman Sea before enjoy a sunset cocktail and a first dinner on board. Datai Bay home of the famous Datai Hotel and the bay boasts some of Langkawi's most idyllic beaches and is the perfect place to stop for a night relaxing on board or taking a quiet evening stroll and drinks at the hotel.





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Day 2: Tanjung Rhu Beach & Kilim River (Hole in the Wall)

Breakfast on board; after a refreshing morning swim Dallinghoo will set sail north for the short sail along Langkawi's northern shores to the Tanjung Rhu Beach; a famous picture perfect beach, which is more sparse and quieter than other beaches. There are several kilometers of white sand beaches and clear waters, the shores are a dense forest. At the low tide, Tanjung Rhu and the nearby islands will be connected as one, the beach will become a soft white sand pile. There is also a legendary cave near Tanjung Rhu, the mysterious text portrayed on the stone wall has yet to be deciphered. After your lunch on board Dallinghoo will lift anchor and motor the short distance to the Kilim River, here you will anchor in the heart of a mangrove forest; Kilim Karst Geoforest Park one of Langkawi's GeoParks. You can try feeding the tame stingrays at the fish farm and famous 'Hole In The Wall' restaurant nearby is the 'Cave of bats' for those who wish to visit.





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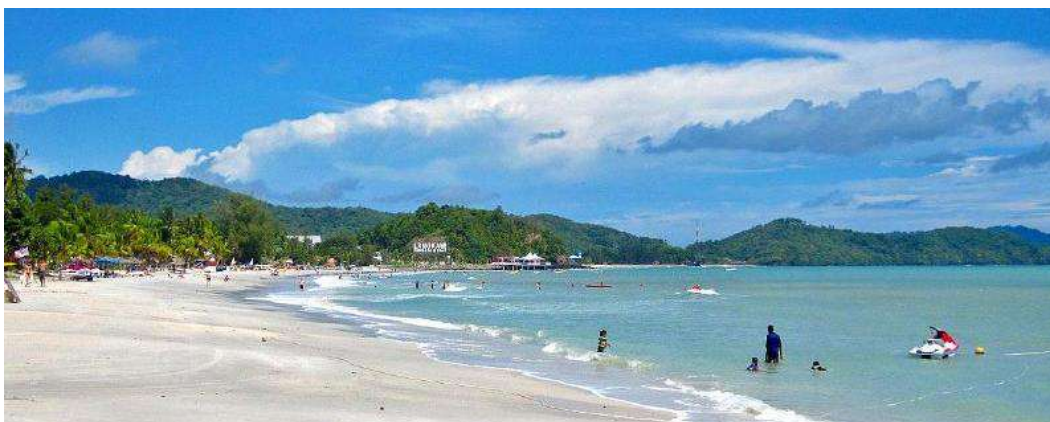
Day 3: Kuah & Pulau Dayang Bunting

An early start today and after breakfast Dallinghoo will leave the Kilim River and set sail down the eastern coast of Langkawi and around the southern islands and into Bass Harbour where she will anchor in the afternoon off the town of Kuah – Langkawi’s capital. A short tender ride to the town’s jetty and the guests can visit the town and do some duty free shopping during the late afternoon and evening once the heat of the day has dropped off. A final bit of shopping in the morning for the shopaholics and then Dallinghoo will cruise the short distance through the bass harbour and out to the island of Pulau Dayang Bunting. This island is famous for the mystical ‘Lake of the Pregnant Maiden’ set in the middle of the island and is surrounded by tropical rainforests. This mystical island is also known for its limestone hills, dense forests and exotic animals.





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Day 4: Pantai Cenang

An early start with a kayak around the islands, allowing you to explore close to the waters edge where the trees over hang and quietly travel watching the monkeys and other animals go about their morning duties. Return to Dallinghoo for a breakfast and then set sail for the short cruise back across Bass Harbour entrance and up the western coast a short distance to Pantai Cenang. This is Langkawi main tourist area, a long sandy beach with shops, bars and restaurants there is also 'Underwater World' Langkawi's aquarium well worth a visit for those who are not tied of looking at fish by this stage!

Day 5: Telaga Harbour

Breakfast and a final swim before Dallinghoo sails back up the western coast and on towards Telaga Harbour. Arriving back into port and secured in the marina, lunch onboard and then depart for the short drive back to the airport.
